



Awareness Session on Women's Safety and Drug Abuse

Report: An awareness session on Women's Safety and Drug Abuse was conducted for the first year BE students by the Bangalore Police, represented by Sub Inspector Zurilal Nayak and Inspector Anil Kumar from Marathahalli Police Station. The session aimed to educate students on the safety measures implemented for women and the legal implications surrounding drug abuse. Officers briefed students on key initiatives introduced by the Karnataka State Police, including the Suraksha App, Namma 112, emergency helplines, and regular patrolling in sensitive areas. Emphasis was placed on self-awareness, timely reporting of suspicious activities, and the effective use of available safety tools. Students were encouraged to seek immediate assistance through official channels in case of emergencies.

The second segment of the session addressed the growing issue of drug abuse among youth. Officers explained the harmful physical, psychological, and social consequences of substance misuse, along with the stringent legal actions under the NDPS Act. They stressed that possession, consumption, or involvement in drug-related activities could result in severe penalties. Students were urged to remain vigilant and make informed choices to safeguard their well-being.

The session concluded with an interactive discussion, where students actively engaged with the officers, asking questions and clarifying doubts related to safety protocols and legal procedures. Overall, the program was highly informative and successfully raised awareness about personal safety and the critical dangers of drug abuse.
